Re: Summary – Timber Harvest Framework Agreement

Tribes interested in harvesting live trees to be used as firewood or other traditional uses must follow the process outlined in Appendix C of the MOU known as the "Tribal Timber Harvest Framework Agreement." Interest has primarily been to provide fuelwood for tribal communities during times of high propane costs and extreme winter temperatures.

In recent years tribes have discovered that the amount of manpower and resources needed to harvest large amounts of timber are outside of the capacity for hand-felling operations. This opened the conversation about tribes contracting logging companies to harvest their fuelwood lots as they would any other timber sale.

Operating plans are developed with the tribe, GLIFWC and with the District Ranger from the district where the harvest will take place in order to detail the terms of the harvest. These operating plans incorporate language of mechanized equipment and how the tribe may contract to a logging entity to complete their timber harvest. In 2018, a team comprised of representatives from the USFS, GLIFWC and various Tribes met to develop procedural documents in order to assist tribes and USFS District Rangers in successfully navigating Appendix C.

There are currently three active operating plans valid for National Forests within the Ceded Territories, attached is a spreadsheet of each tribal request for which an Operating Plan was developed.
